Go fishing every chance you get!



Steelhead Habitat Restora-

tion—Day #2 Volunteers on the second and final planting day for Sespe Fly Fisher's Steelhead Habitat Restoration Project <u>got the job done!</u> Although the photo on right could be misleading (an awful lot of shovel leaning) in fact, all volunteers worked hard to complete the planting of a total (for both days) of 20 Coastal Live Oaks, and 134 native shrubs as companion plants.

Randy Nelson worked both days, and as many of you know, spent a long time writing and rewriting the \$1500 Grant from Fly Fishers International for Steelhead Habitat Restoration, with support and assistance from the Southwest Council of FFI to get the grant submitted and approved.

With a little encouragement from Sespe Fly Fisher members, there might be some hope for him to try again for a grant in 2020 as this is a historically strong and important club project, inspired by Yvon Chouinard's lifelong commitment to the

FISHING REPORT – EASTERN SIERRAS

Winter Fishing for Wild Trout

We set out with great expectations on our first Sespe outing of the New Year! Our group, Mike Toomey, Lee White, Earl and Anne Arnold, Mike Ogden, Thad Skypien, and I all met in Bishop on Friday, Jan 24th.

We had anticipated fishing the Buckley Ponds, but found out that they were frozen over, so we took a quick trip to the Wild Trout section of the Lower Owens. Always important to be flexible when Fishing!

At the Lower Owens, Fishing was pretty slow for us but the weather was warm and the wind was low. Later, while enjoying a great dinner at the Bishop Bowling Alley, we met up with guide Pat Jaeger, a recent speaker at our club, for a quick visit.

The next day we fished Hot Creek. Another beautiful day also brought a number of fly fishers as the creek had plenty of activity yet the fishing remained slow. A couple of our party (Mike Toomey and Ann Bull) caught brown trout. Lee White and I fished the interpretive section below the hatchery and encountered many rainbows but only had a few strikes as they ap-



peared to be spawning.

On Sunday a front began moving through and snow squalls kept us from fishing the Upper Owens, so we returned to the Wild Trout section. The water flow had increased from Saturday to Sunday on the Lower Owens but was still manageable. Great conditions again at the Wild Trout waters with temps in the high 50's and low wind. There were a lot of fly fishermen, maybe over twenty on that 1/2 mile stretch, yet fishing remained



slow all around.

Earl Arnold was able to bring in another Brown. The Kern River Fly Fishers were there as well and had similar results but 1 member managed to hook into 5 trout that morning. We were left to pondor what the heck that guy did that we didn't. That's the way fishing can be ... well, fishing is great, but sometimes the hooking is slow.

Still there are always friends to laugh with and new things to learn. I think we all returned home with smiles on our faces so it was a good trip!

BUILDING A BAMBOO ROD, PT. 3

Scraping, Sanding, Planing and (a little) Complaining

Tom Hall, Doug Treutelaar, Lee White, Randy Nelson, Tom Hall and I, with support from Bill Loehr and Steve Schalla, have now moved from working on rod butts to tips! We each have 12 tip strips, designed to make two rod tips eventually so that we will have a spare. The process of scraping the enamel side of the bamboo, then sanding, and then planing each strip into a thin, tapered equilateral triangle shape has began again, but this time it's much more delicate work.

Planing can be tedious so some light-hearted complaining livens things up (these guys can be pretty funny!). Most of the time is pretty quiet though, as it's very easy to get out of alignment and

even easier to break a strip, because once planed they are thin as twigs.

We all got a morale boost when Bill Loehr brought out some samples of reel seats, cork grips, ferrules, guides and thread so he could order what we need to finish our rods.

Guides Choice Nymph

Back in the day, my go-to nymph was a Gold Ribbed Hares Ear Nymph and that was pretty much the case through the 1960's, 70's and mid-way through the 80's. Then in the late 80's I was fishing the lower Sacramento River with some minor success with a hare's ear. The guide handed me one of these nymphs and said try this and the rest of the day we caught and released so many trout that I lost count. Since, that day, this has been my go-to nymph. This pattern is like a hopped up Gold Ribbed Hare's Ear on steroids. You have to give this fly a try, you won't be sorry.



Fly Ingredients:

Hook: Size #16, #14, #12 Nymph Hook Thread: 6/0 Brown or Red Thread Bead: Gold Bead to Fit Weight: Lead Wire Wing Case: Pearl or Iridescent Flashabou Legs: Partridge or Hen Back Thorax: Peacock Herl Body: Hare's Ear Blended Tail: Hare's Mask Fur Ribbing: Gold Wire

Tying Instructions:

Slide the bead on the hook and then insert in to the vise.

Push the bead up behind the hook eye and then put 5 to 6 wraps of lead wire up against the bead.

.Cover lead wire and hook shank with thread and then position thread on hook shank at the start of the bend.

Cut a piece of hare's mask fur with guard hairs, about the width of the hook gap, and secure to hook to form the tail.

.Tie in and secure the gold wire above the hook bend where the tailed was tied off.

Now start dubbing hare's ear fur from the tail to about 2/3 of remaining hook shank (remember to taper the body as your dubbing and wrapping), and tie off.

Wrap gold wire through dubbed body and tie off.

Now, where the dubbing ended, tie in a piece of flashabou, for the wing case, and fold back out of the way.

Tie in 3 or 4 strands of peacock herl by the tips, twist them around the thread for a more secure wrap, and then wrap up to the bead and tie off and clip.

.Pull over flashabou wing case and tie off and clip.

•Tie in a partridge or hen back hackle feather by the tips, curved side down, and stoke fibers towards the tail, making a nice full wrap, tie off and clip excess (make sure that that all of the hackle fibers are stroked back).

.If you used red thread, form a thin band of thread behind the bead, whip finish and apply head cement, and you're done.

If you used brown thread, tie off and clip and then tie in red thread and form a thin band of thread behind the bead, whip finish and apply head cement, and you're done.


